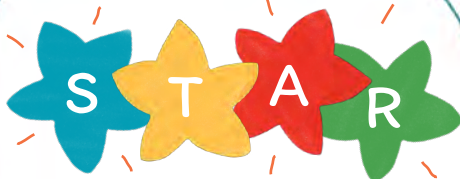

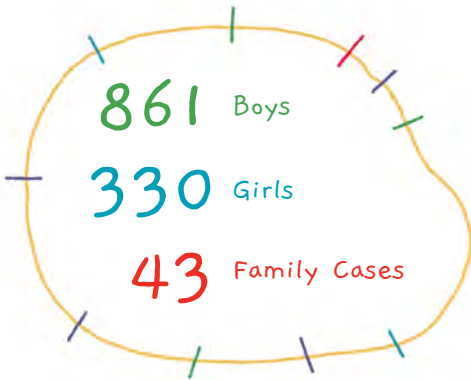

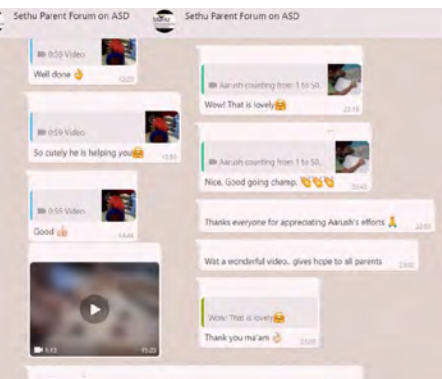
## AATISH - Autism Advocacy Training Intervention Support and Hope

The AATISH team at Sethu program builds partnerships with children with autism and their families.



Through workshops like **Aarambh**, **Asha** and **Toilet-training**, we were able to empower parents and professionals to teach good practice in the field of autism.

This year saw the birth of the **ASD Family Support Group**, a forum for families to meet monthly and share their successes and struggles as well as get support from the professionals at Sethu. The WhatsApp group has over 100 participants who are in constant touch with each other.

The AATISH team attended a fantastic workshop on **Social Thinking®** conducted by Michelle Garcia Winner in Mumbai and was part of the ICAN Indo-Canadian Conference on Autism in Hyderabad.



**World Autism Awareness Month** was celebrated in April 2019 through numerous newspaper articles and discussions on the radio. Parents and children shared their personal experiences living with autism all through the month.



## Working with Schools

We believe that our partnership with Sethu sets a unique example for how Corporates, Foundations and NGOs can successfully come together to drive social change. Partnerships are always greater than the sum of the individual efforts and Cipla Foundation strongly believes in fostering collaboration. Our synergy is the present and the future of making lives better.

Gnyandeep, supported by Cipla Foundation is a Balwadi (government run preschool) teacher training program. In 2019 we started the groundwork to train the teachers' supervisors or "Mukhya Sevikas" so that they could provide ongoing support to the teachers after the completion of the Gnyandeep program.

Tarang, supported by Essity, is Sethu's Inclusive Education Program. Two schools, Manovikas and Chubby Cheeks, adopted Sethu's new developmentally-appropriate curriculum. Now, children are taught skills in a sequential rather than a random manner. Both schools implement the Universal Design for Learning—the ultimate lesson delivery strategy to make classrooms inclusive.

### **Tarang Symposium**

Schools and the teachers who were partners in the Tarang program organised by Sethu were felicitated and the Tarang Manual for Inclusive Education was released.

### **Phonics and Phonological Awareness**

Sethu's in house training program for teachers on awareness of sounds in spoken words and letter-sound relationships.



### **Class Act 2019**

Sethu's annual workshop was held in South Goa at Manovikas English Medium school. The topic was ADHD and related behavioral issues.

### **Let's Get Online**

Philippa Weitz from the UK explored the issues and dilemmas around online therapeutic work, highlighting the importance of sound procedures and technology support.

### **Comprehensive Sexuality Education**

Dr. Nandita conducted two residential workshops at New Delhi and Shillong for sexuality trainers in all 26 institutions of the Christian Brothers. (CCBI) across India.

The Sethu team exposed me to different ways of teaching and evaluating which was not a part of my teaching style before. I enjoyed incorporating a visual timetable, classroom rules, and started introducing concepts in multiple ways. We noticed changes in the performance of the children and realized that activity-based teaching helps them understand and express what they learn in a better way.
